

Greetings, "I'm Ba-a-ack".

Yes, I am back again as your LIFE MEMBER CHAIRPERSON. After the Board of Directors election, I was asked if I would accept a nomination as your Chairperson once again and I said that I would.

Before the election, in the annual Life Member meeting, there were some items brought up for action of Life Membership Committee to either investigate or resolve:

 A motion to define what constitutes "cause" in the case of an expulsion from Life Membership.

> This is covered on the Life Membership application under item #9, where it states that a membership may be revoked for cause should that individual bring discredit upon the REACT name.

 A motion to research and find a copy of the policy that was enacted several years back regarding procedure for the removal of a life member. A copy of this procedure will be mailed to all Life Members of record.

> This I am planning to include in a new Life Member Directory to come out around the end of this year.

 The forming of a committee with regard to an investigation of a Life Member.

> This has been done but the names of the investigating committee are not for publication at this time.

Last year the Life Member Committee voted on a new due's structure for life members based on 25 times the current regular member dues at time of application. Because of the number of applications submitted from the time of convention until the Winter Board of Directors Meeting (there were only two{2}), the Board of Directors felt that with this structure the Life Membership ranks would not increase at a satisfactory rate. It was at that time the Board of Directors passed a permanent due's structure of \$300 with no reductions to any member (since the Board meeting to the 1995 Convention there were six (6) additional Life Members added). It looks as if this may bring us more Life Members this year.

From the Grassroots

First let me thank the 77 teams who placed their confidence in me with their vote. I will do my utmost to fulfill that trust.

Part of what I want to bring to the Board is honest and straight forward communications. Teams and members cannot operate in a vacuum. Everyone needs to know where the organization stands and in what direction it is headed. But the Board of Directors cannot do it alone. We are directors and that implies that we will lead in a certain direction. We get that direction from the opinions of the membership. And that places some of the burden on you, the members. If the only opinions we, the directors, hear are the same voices that have been heard in the past, the organization will continue to head in the same direction as in the past. We need to hear from all the members. The ones who have never written, the ones who think no one cares about their opinions. Well, someone on the Board is asking for your input now.

I tried to get back some of that Team based wisdom when I sent out material during the election campaign. I included a survey to the teams asking five (5) questions to get their responses. Because of low budget I could only send this survey to those Teams who had voted in the past couple of years, plus the newest teams. The questions were:

- What are the top three benefits the members want from REACT International?
- 2) When the Board considers major changes to REACT, such as: the dues; the Life Member Program; the REACT International By-Laws; etc. should all the Teams be allowed to vote by mail for or against the proposed change?
- 3) Would more members go to the Annual Convention if it was held over a weekend?
- 4) Rank the following items that you feel the REACT Board should be working hardest on. (Increased membership National publicity for REACT Discounts for members Grants or donations to REACT International Controlling teams and members Training for members Other).
- 5) Does your Team feel that REACT International keeps them adequately informed on what's happening?

I've shared the answers with the other Board of Directors before departing from this years Convention. I think it's important that the results are shared with all the members too. Here's the answers I've received so far: 1) The opinions expressed here were enlightening, though varied. The most popular answers were: nationwide (all nations)
promotion and Public
Relations; more information/
better communications at all
levels; membership incentives
and recruitment; insurance
for emergency vehicles and
radio equipment; and new
product reviews.

- 2) Yes 105; No = 6; Only Board should vote = 1; only delegates should vote = 14.
- 3) Yes = 7; No = 31.
- 4) The items were ranked: #1 Increased membership. #2 -National publicity for REACT. #3 - Grants or donations to REACT. #4 - Training for members. #5 - Discounts for members. #6 - Other (Instruction Manuals and Videos, Train Councils, Get information via Team Topics, New Product Reviews, Better Communications to Teams, More Corporate Sponsors, Improved Insurance, More MOU's, 800 Number). #7 -Controlling teams and members.
- 5) Yes = 23; No = 89.

Some steps have been taken at this years Convention.

1995 Field Director Election

The candidates for the 1995 election were Mike Chuven, Craig Hoephner, Richard Gamble, and Bonnie Zygmunt. The ballots were retrieved from the Omaha Post Office on Saturday, July 15, and stored in the hotel safe until time to count them on Sunday, July 16.

About 1:00 p.m., the Membership Committee consisting of Kenneth Green and Richard Pratz met with observers Mike McQueen, Team #C-10; Zelma Dassa, Team #4552; Pearl Harmon, Office Manager; and the candidates to tally the votes.

There were 166 envelopes counted. Of these eleven (11) ballots were disqualified because the information on the back of the envelope was not complete. There were 156 envelopes opened and 155 inner envelopes were removed. One Team had enclosed their ballot in the outer envelope which meant that this vote was disqualified.

After counting the 155 ballots Bonnie Zygmunt was declared the new Field Director.

The Membership Committee wants to thank all candidates for their participation in this years election. We also wish to thank the observers and the Office Manager for their assistance in counting the ballots.

The Field Director election is the one chance each year that teams have an opportunity to help determine who will lead REACT. If you Team does not participate, other Teams will make the choice for you.



During the 1995 REACT
International Convention, the
motion was made by this
committee for REACT
International to subscribe to a
local Internet Service and obtain
our own e-mail (electronic mail)
address. Following one objection
concerning funding, the members,
led by Frank Jennings, Team
#4700, passed the hat to collect
nearly \$250 within a matter of

minutes! The object was withdrawn in light of this strong show of support by the members and the motion was passed.

Two days later, this task was accomplished. On the way to San Antonio, I spent a couple of days in Wichita. REACT International CEO/President Kenneth Green obliged me with a tour of the REACT International Office on

Friday. The next day, we visited a local computer retailer. I convinced the retailer that being a computer dealer from Texas, he should let me buy at wholesale pricing. Rather than to loose the sale, he agreed, and REACT International had a new 28.8kb V.34 modem for the office. By 5:00 p.m., this modem and Internet Software was installed and Kenneth Green had arranged for REACT International's account

with the local Internet Service Provider (ISP). On Monday, Kenneth Green demonstrated the new software to the office staff.

REACT International is now on the Internet, using the address of "react@wichita.fn.net". So far, over fifty REACT members have contacted me with their e-mail addresses. If you have not been receiving e-mail from me, send a message to me at "react@texas.net" with your address and team or council affiliation, and you will be added to the list for future sendings.

The first week of REACT International being "live", we held two sessions on the Internet Relay Chat (IRC) channel of "#REACT". These have been established as regular weekly sessions on Sunday and Thursday nights. Jack Murrell of Circle City REACT, Team #C261(Indianapolis) is the host of the Sunday session, held at 10:00 p.m. CDT. Larry Skinner of Sedgwick County REACT, Team #4208 (Wichita) is the host of the Thursday sessions, held at 8:00 p.m. CDT. The IRC channel is alwasy "#REACT". If you need help in finding how to access this, send me an e-mail.

Three of our Board of Director members, Kenneth Green, CEO/ President; Bonnie Zygmunt, Secretary; and Richard Pratz, Treasurer have Internet e-mail addresses, and have been participating in the weekly IRC Chat sessions. It is common to receive responses from them or the REACT International Office Manager, Pearl Harmon, within 24

hours and sometimes within a matter of minutes, depending upon when they next access their e-mail.

About half of the (so far known) REACT members are running on American On Line (AOL.COM), with a few on Prodigy or Compuserve. Unfortunately, unless they have the latest 2.50 version software from AOL and the new WINSOCK.DLL software, those members will not be able to access much of the Internet, including the IRC channels and the FTP file transfers. They also cannot receive mail messages with files attached, if originated from outside of AOL.

Two weeks after the convention, after conversation with Frank Jennings Team #4700, we sent email messages to 17 Internet Providers in that state. Within 25 minutes we had received six (6) replies, including one telling us about a new provider that wasn't in the directories yet. By the next day, we had located three (3) providers in that area capable of supplying ISP for the REACT Convention next July. Of course, they were also interested in recruiting the local members as new customers in the meantime.

Rose City (Windsor) REACT has the distinction of having the first REACT Home Page on the Web. It became active during the week of August 14, 1995. You can see Stewart Mantha and John Richardson's efforts by using Netscape (or other compatible web browser) to access it at the address of "http:// www.wincom.net/REACT/".

Shannon Blackburn of San
Antonio REACT was asked to
author a web page about Outdoor
Recreation in the area. When you
click on the spot for information
about the author, you get a plug
about REACT! That's sneaky,
Shannon! Keep up the good work.
Check it out using Netscape to

is also up on the Internet, at "http://
www.digimall.com/cobra/i.html".

Financial Investment Update

Effective July 12, 1995, REACT International has purchased \$10,250 worth of Paramount Communications Corporate Bonds maturing in 2002 at 7.2%, BA-2 Grade at \$102.5 with an annual yield of 7.137%, with \$4.17 prepaid interest and a \$4 service charge. Total purchase cost was \$10,258.17.

We now have the following investment portfolio: *

Corporate Bonds \$51,534 US Govt. Bonds \$17,722 Mort. & Assets \$5,977** Money Fund \$2,851***

The present rate of income from these investments will be \$6,000 per year. Our goal is to have a minimum of \$100,000 invested prior to years end. If we can attain that goal our interest income will average \$7,500 per year. Our overall goal is to have \$200,000 invested in our investment ladder by the year end of 1996.
