

Hi everybody, this is Will Stanley, with the 60th Anniversary Committee writing to you.

I have heard there are questions regarding the cost of the 60th Anniversary Celebration. Well, in the interest of full disclosure, let me list the various components of a meeting like this and perhaps then you will see that you are getting a fantastic bargain!

First off there are costs associated with the meeting, such as:


The *REACT* International Traffic System Part 2

Last month's article focused on the *REACT* Traffic System history and mission. This month the focus will be on *REACT* Traffic Systems routine Net Operations. The purpose of any net is to provide a means for orderly communication within a group of stations. It is also a means of regularly checking and exercising communications circuits. In a directed net, a net control station (NCS) organizes and controls all activity. All *REACT* Traffic System Nets are Directed nets. The reason the traffic system exercises it communications circuits is because when needed it can establish an effective Tactical Net. Tactical nets are used for real-time coordination of activities related to the emergency. This is a fast moving often less formal operation.


Tactical nets are used after or prior to an event, after an event has occurred or during and after a lengthy event. They are found on the front lines of response planning, response, disaster assessment, recovery and Search and Rescue operations. There may be several of these nets running at the same time; on different frequencies and from widespread locations and organizations all reporting to a master Tactical NCS at the EOC.

The traffic Systems primary mode of communication is Winlink. Winlink is worldwide system for sending and receiving e-mail via radio. It is a versatile communications platform, functions using RF (Radio frequency) or an internet connection. The available modes are HF Pactor, Ardop and VARA, VHF/UHF Packet, Satellite phone, MESH network, Post Office (RMS Relay), and Telnet peer-to-peer. In November of this year we will be starting a Winlink check-in net, the details are being finalized and details will be published in the *REACT*er.




The Traffic System also has a Push To Talk Zello channel "REACT Traffic System "this channel is used for passing formal messages such as Radiograms and ICS-213 message forms. This channel and the backup channel "REACT/Traffic System" is for all unsecure voice traffic internationally. The REACT International Traffic System conducts a weekly traffic net on this Zello channel and is open to all in EMCOMM communicators the net begins at 9:00 PM US Eastern. Currently this is the one net that all traffic system

members are encouraged to participate in. As mentioned in Part 1, *REACT* Traffic Handlers come from all teams.



During disasters and major emergencies traffic handlers monitor and check-in to *REACT* Internationals Echolink nodes 109779 **REACT** or 336037. You can also connect using DMR, through *REACT*'s Conference Server, the DMR Talk Group number is 3740. Check-ins are done periodically every 2-4 hours, to give situation reports and pass traffic as needed. There is also the *REACT* International Worldwide All-Mode net at 9pm US Eastern on Tuesdays. There is a pre-net on Zello Channel "*REACT* International" the purpose of this pre-net is to let none licensed amateur radio operator to be acknowledged on the *REACT* International Echolink Net. Pre-net check-in time is 8:45 pm US Eastern on Tuesday.



Next month in part 3, the article will focus on *REACT* Traffic System routine daily operations, preevent operations, response operations and potential recovery operations as they pertain to supporting *REACT* Teams, any supported agencies and the public.

PROMOTING REACT AND RECRUITING NEW MEMBERS SOUTHEX EXPO IN TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO

One of the main challenges expressed by many *REACT* Teams worldwide is attracting and recruiting new members. How can we gain new members...or even new Teams?

One way is to set up displays at events to promote the organization.

REACT is a voluntary organization, which requires members to contribute time and resources to give back to society and therefore make a difference in people's lives. Whether it is assisting with events, emergencies or disasters, REACT Teams and members strive to attain the organization's motto, "Public Service Through Communications." To be effective, members are required to demonstrate commitment, engage with administrative duties, organize activities, participate in and conduct training and exercises, and execute projects. There is an innate desire by many citizens to help. Promoting REACT allows such persons to learn about the organization and the unique opportunity to contribute to society using radio communications as the tool.

During the period 20th – 24th October 2021, *REACT* Teams in Trinidad and Tobago mounted a display at the Southex Expo at the Gulf City Mall. It was the first major project undertaken since the start of the pandemic early in 2019. The opportunity was provided by *REACT* 112, Krishnan Seukeran, who negotiated arrangements with the Southex organization for a booth. The *REACT* Trinidad and Tobago Council was engaged, and President of *REACT* Team 6006, *REACT* 601 Trevor Brathwaite, took up the challenge to be the event coordinator and for his Team to be the lead. The site lead was the Team's Vice President, Neil Jones *REACT* 629. Most of the nine Teams participated in one way or the other via encouragement or providing resources. Expressions of thanks are therefore extended to the Council, Teams, and members for all of the work undertaken.



Several Teams and members contributed in various ways to the display. This included banners, buntings, flyers, giveaways, multimedia, radio equipment, refreshments, and so on. Members volunteered to assist with setting up the booth and to be rostered as marketers and demonstrators on the expo days. Through a collaboration with the Office of Disaster Preparedness and Management (ODPM) and Operations Manager - Dennis Marcelle, an adequate supply of brochures on Hurricanes, Tsunamis, and Disaster Preparedness was provided as material for distribution to visitors.

While many challenges had to be overcome, such as obtaining all display material in a timely matter, and the rostering of sufficient members for the days of the expo, the event was well managed and ended up being quite successful.

Given that we were still in a pandemic with strict COVID-19 protocols to be adhered to, the usual volume of visitors and discussion would have been restricted. However, the Team reported that over the five days of the event, over 1,500 visitors expressed an interest in joining *REACT*. If this converts into added membership, it will represent a major strengthening of the human resource capability of *REACT* in the twin-island nation. All visitors to the booth are appreciated.

REACT promotional flyers were produced entitled "**Join** *REACT*" to be given out to everyone who stopped at or passed by the booth.



Radio communications via VHF LMR repeater was established. The technical team that included the Council's Amateur Radio advisor, Arnold Griffith *REACT* 100, was challenged, however, due to the persistence and resourcing of *REACT* 112 and assistance from supporting members, this was eventually achieved. VHF Radio networks were held every day for the duration of the expo, which on most days was from 10 am to 7 pm. Net control operators did a phenomenal job included Ken Mohammed *REACT* 634, Mac Nunes *REACT* 130, and Akeem Ali *REACT* 146, among others.

Of significance was a special Citizen's Band (CB) Radio network that was held on 23rd October at 6 pm, whereby all CBers were invited to participate. Net control operators included Balchan Sookdeo *REACT* 625, and Garnet Blackburn *REACT* 633. This was momentous as it was the first time in a few decades that a *REACT* CB net was held in Trinidad and Tobago. Greetings on behalf of *REACT* International, Inc. were extended during the net. CB was only "legalized" in 2019 as a result of *REACT*'s persistence with the regulatory authority and Government. In 2020, *REACT* developed CB Radio guidelines. It was, therefore, fitting that in 2021, CB operations were re-established, and hopefully activities will be increased going forward.

Some of the lessons apparent from the event include:

- 1. Commence planning at the earliest opportunity.
- 2. Have a kick-off meeting with all stakeholders.
- 3. Document the plan, expectations, and targets.
- 4. Establish a schedule, material manifest, and assignments/tasking portfolio.
- 5. Have regular update meetings.
- 6. Consider sub-committees for specialized areas such as technical, hospitality, and decoration.
- 7. Communicate regularly, in writing, using technology where possible such as virtual meetings, e-mail, instant messaging, and of course radio communications.
- 8. Have an after-action review to determine lessons learned.
