

Constitution & Bylaws

There are many organizations in the world. Some are very informal like the neighborhood quilting group or a few couples who meet to play cards once a week. Other organizations are very formal like library systems, government agencies and public corporations. And we have every kind of organization in-between. The ladies quilting group does not need much in the way of leadership. But larger entities like home owners associations, and other corporations that have organized governance by boards and committees need something to prevent total chaos at meetings.

This is most often often accomplished using rules of order in association Bylaws. An organization's Bylaws describe the various reasons for existing, who will be the membership of the organization, who will govern and how they will govern.

If an entity is incorporated under state law, they will have Articles of Incorporation and Bylaws. If an entity is not incorporated, then a Constitution is used in place of Article of Incorporation. These documents work together to describe the reason for existing and how the entity will be governed during its life.

State laws usually govern what is included in Articles of Incorporation. Unincorporated entities don't need a constitution but its good to have one. All applicants for a *REACT* International, Inc. Team charter are required to provide Articles of Incorporation or a Constitution along with Bylaws upon approval of their team name.

This demonstrates there is leadership and order within the applicant organization and allows *REACT* International, Inc to maintain its compliance with IRS rules for its tax exempt status. Teams that do not have their own tax empt status can inherit that status under a 1972 ruling between *REACT* International, Inc. and the IRS.

That's all for now. I hope to make this the first of a series of informative articles.



REACT Nariva/Mayaro County Renovates Local Bus Shelter

REACT Team 6009 Nariva/Mayaro County had built four Bus Shelters in the community to serve school children and citizens, by shading them from the elements in the tropical climate of Trinidad and Tobago.

On Saturday 4th February 2023, the shelter located at the St. Therese R.C. Primary School, Naparima Mayaro Road, Rio Claro was refurbished. The works completed included:

Removal of deteriorated galvanize sheets on roof and re-sheeting,

·Rust removal and re-painting of the structures, and

·Sanitization of the immediate surroundings.

The project commenced at 7:30 a.m. and ended at 12:30 p.m.

Eight persons attended to volunteer their services. Present were four members of the Team, namely,

Four community members also joined to assist. A total of 22 man hours was volunteered. Materials and supplies were donated by members of the Team. REACT should be in every territory around the world!

Given the organization's motto of "Public Service Through Communications", the service provided by REACT should be embedded in every community around the globe. Communication is needed for public service events – cultural, sporting, etc. and is critical for emergencies and disasters. REACT provides a unique opportunity for any citizen of any Country to volunteer to provide communications to meet these needs.

REACT operates on the basis of chartered Teams. To become a member of *REACT*, this is achieved by joining (or starting) a *REACT* Team.

If you are reading this article and are not a member, and there are no Teams nearby, consider starting one. It takes just 3 persons. A quick thumb through The *REACT*er magazines or by browsing the various social media sites of Teams should give a good idea of the purpose and activities undertaken by members. While communications underpin *REACT* activities, Team activities can vary by geographic and local circumstances. Some Teams do various public service events such as races (walkathons, marathons, cycle races, etc.). In contrast, others are more geared towards emergency communications, working closely with served agencies and first responders.

Being a *REACT* member requires that you give of yourself, your time, talent, and effort, in order to fulfill the organization's mandate. It is not often easy. However, if you like to give back to your community or looking for an opportunity to serve, *REACT* can be the avenue. Apart from providing communications, getting involved in Team administration is also encouraged. There are annual dues, and IDs are issued to each member every year. Recruitment of new members for existing Teams, as well as chartering new Teams, are both necessary to keep the organization moving forward and with new and fresh innovations.

In 2023, Region 9 (all areas outside of the United States of America) saw two new Teams being chartered.

For the first time, a Team was chartered in India, Team 6274 Tripura India *REACT*. The convenor is Mr. Arup Dhar. In Trinidad and Tobago, which already has several Teams, the 10th Team, Team 6278 *REACT* County St. Patrick TT, was formed. The convenor is Mrs. Angela Henry-Small, who is no stranger to *REACT*. Hello Region One Teams and Members,

Allow me to introduce myself, John Mahon in Massachusetts as the recently appointed Director for Region 1 to fill the remainder of the current term, ending in June, 2024. As some of you may know, our previous Director, Warren Deitz and his Team have elected to surrender their *REACT* International Inc.[®] Team Charter. Per our *REACT* Bylaws, all Director's must be a member of a Team in good standing. With the surrendering of the Team Charter Mr. Deitz is not eligible to serve in any official capacity.

The Director's seat is not new to me. I opted to not seek reelection in 2021 due to a number of personal reasons and other pursuits of interest. I have always offered a helping hand to the office staff with whatever I can do to help. Having been in the REACT program since the Blizzard of '78', serving in many positions, from the team level to REACT International operations, has certainly been educational to say the least.

One of the biggest member complaints is not being able to reach or speak with the Directors of our organization, to the point that it has caused the loss of Teams and members, not Regionally, but Nationally. During my 2018-2021 term as Director, one of the frustrations was the high number of Members and Teams with inaccurate contact information. There will be continued efforts to use the contact information you provide during renewals or updates, but I invite you to contact me with any and all questions, concerns and especially any ideas to help us grow our Auxiliary Communication Service to our Communities.

I have also been asked to chair the Training & Development Committee. The lack of progress, structure or updates with this committee lead to the discovery of the disqualifying events of previous chairman. It was acknowledged that he did not have interest in the training aspect. This is a requirement to maintain standards throughout all Auxiliary Communication Disciplines, be it ARRL, ARES, RACES, MARS, Salvation Army or even GMRS radio operators. None of whom can be effective if we do not speak the same language.

Finally, I am including both the official *REACT* International methods of contact, as well as personal methods through my local team. There are eight ways for you to reach and talk to, at or with me. Try one or all of them, especially the Winlink system, which is new for me, again.

MINUTES REACT International Special Board Meeting January 18, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 3:00 PM, PDT via Zoom teleconference. by Chairman Capodanno, Minutes Taken by Recording.

It was confirmed that a Quorum was established.

Agenda

Director Zych moved to accept the agenda, second by Director Capodanno. R3-Y R7-Y R8-Y R9-Y Motion Passed.

Meeting minutes

Director Capodanno moved to approve the minutes from August 28, 2022, second by Director Jones. R3-Y R7-Y R8-Y R9-Y Motion Passed.

Director Capodanno moved to approve the minutes from December 06, 2022, second by Director Zych. R3-Y R7-Y R8-Y R9-Y Motion Passed.

Announcements

REACT International investigation found that Duchess/Putnam County REACT accepted the donation of Duchess-Putnam County vehicles, an ambulance and Chevy Tahoe. The Team was supposed to destroy the municipal registration plates and register the vehicles in the team's name and get their own insurance. REACT requested a response by January 07, 2023. An Email was received from Duchess-Putnam County Team 4938 on January 17, 2023, announcing their intent to surrender the Team Charter alleging a vague lack of transparency of REACT International without specifically citing a single complaint. The surrendering of the Team Charter is a disqualifying event preventing Mr. Deitz from continuing as a director or in any capacity for REACT International.

An Email was received from John Soto on November 03, 2022, questioning the discrepancies between proposed policy 1-03 versus the final version; methods for dating business communications; postal mail time and date stamps within twenty-four hours of drop off; parcels sent overnight by carrier; an incoherent rambling of policy 3-06 from 2015 where the Board of Directors passed the propose changes, without any specific point or question being asked; 2015 membership dues was answered by noting administration fee was dropped as found in the September 11, 2014, *REACT*er. The change in address from Suitland, MD to Glendale, CA was questioned, and another rambling of the release of corporate documents.

A letter from John Soto dated September 26, 2022, alleging "somewhat strange manner, somewhat violent threats unbecoming" from Facebook content. Mr. Soto interpreted his inability to research, obtain and read material in the public realm as a conspiracy by the organization to hide financials, regardless of the annual postings at the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) website.

A letter from John Soto dated October 02, 2022, calling for President Capodanno "immediately" respond to, and comply with, his demands within one week regarding the demands.

An Email was received from John Soto on November 04, 2022, questioning minute entries from 2010, 2011, & 2013; the revision of Policy 6.02 in 2018, questioning the changes in Bylaws in 1997, 1999, 2000, 2001, 2003, 2006, and 2014. Mr. Soto questioned the validity of the Corporate President's inclusion in all committees, although it is plainly stated and readily available. Mr. Soto questioned the *REACT* International website being "non-operational" on the presumption the blackout is intentionally blocking access to the membership and public, noting the limited resources available at the store for purchase. These concerns were addressed, although readily available if he had the ability to read the *REACT* rissues from 2011 to present.

A letter from John Soto dated December 17, 2022, demanding access to the 2023 Annual Board Meeting via Zoom at *REACT* International's expense, to answer his demand for Council recognition, and demanding an itemized format of a yearly financial report from the past 5 years because there were none noted in the *REACT* er from the past five years. The posting of the 990 from 1998 – 2020 are posted on the *REACT* International website along with Minutes.

New Business

A letter sent to Glen Daniels and John Soto dated September 23, 2022, regarding their ongoing refusal to submit a completed charter application for Orange/Ulster County REACT Team 6041.

The Orange/Ulster County team was issued a team charter based on the word of Director Warren Deitz and was conditional upon *REACT* International Inc., receiving the required Team's Employer Identification Numbers (EIN), the Team's Letter from the Secretary of State, the Team's minutes wherein electing team officers and Team Bylaws. *REACT* International forwarded the sample Team Bylaws to Mr. Daniels, John Soto, Warren Deitz and Orange/Ulster County.

Director Capodanno moved to revoke Orange/Ulster Team for non-compliant, second by Director Zych. R3-Y R7-Y R8-Y R9-Y Motion Passed.

Election of Officers

The Chairman opened the floor for Executive Vice President. Christopher Wiackley. John Soto was nominated. Mr. Soto team was revoked and not eligible to run.

Director Capodanno moves to elect n Mr. Wiackley as EVP, seconded by Director Goswami.

R3-Y R7-Y R8-Y R9-Y Mr. Wiackley was elected.

The Chairman opened the floor for Secretary. Lorinda Fong, Lee Besing, were nominated.

A vote was taken and was a tie.

Director Jones moves to table until next meeting, second by Director Zych.

R3-Y R7-Y R8-Y R9-Y Motion Passed.

Director Vacancies

Director Capodanno moved to nominate John Mahon to Region one un-expired term, second by Director Zych. R3-Y R7-Y R8-Y R9-Y Motion Passed.

Adjournment
Director Jones moved to adjourn at 3:37 PM PDT, second by Director Capodanno. R1-Y R3-Y R7-Y R8-Y R9-Y Motion Passed.
