

## REACT Month Virtual Panel Discussion "The Role of Weather In Being Disaster Ready"

#### **Hurricane Season is almost here!**

The month of May marks *REACT* Month, as well as the National Disaster Prevention and Preparedness Month (NDPPM) in Trinidad and Tobago.

For a third year running, *REACT* has partnered with the Office of Disaster Preparedness and Management (ODPM), to host a virtual panel discussion. This year's topic is "*The Role of Weather In Being Disaster Ready.*" The event was held on Saturday 13<sup>th</sup> May 2023, commencing at 6:00pm (UTC-4) with a duration of one and a half hours.

Panelists included Kalain Hosein (Weather Anchor - Guardian Media), Eric Mackie (Regional Coordinator - ODPM), Brian Shields "Mr. Weatherman" (Meteorologist - WFTV9), and Gary Benjamin (Senior Meteorologist - TTMET), with moderator Ravindranath Goswami, Region 9 Director of *REACT* International, Inc. Other partners included the Tobago Emergency Management Agency (TEMA), and HeartlightTV.

The event was informative, as discussion included the process by which meteorologists go through in preparing weather forecasts, what to expect for the 2023 Atlantic Hurricane Season, and practical tips for citizens to mitigate the effects of associated hazards.










## Glen Hagstrom 1940-2023
