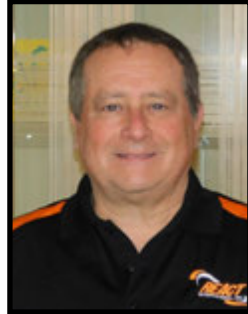

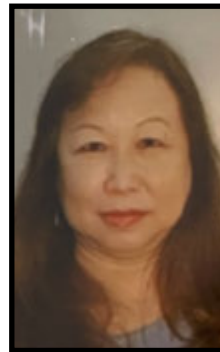

Multiple NYC Area Teams assist with NYC Marathon

These 3 NYC Teams provided mutual aid during the New York City marathon:

RICHMOND COUNTY REACT TEAM 6269
EMERGENCY RADIO LONG ISLAND REACT TEAM 6276
BRONX COUNTY REACT TEAM 6280



Each Team covered a different mile along the 26.2-mile race course. The Teams were responsible for ensuring the safety of the Runners, Integrity of the race and observing everything as an added set of eyes for both Law Enforcement and all the other government agencies involved in this 8+ hour race.

Teams arrived as early as 02:00, with most arriving around the 06:00 – 08:00 period. They were released from the race after the last major group of runners and the “Sweep Buses,” used for picking up runners who retired from the race, passed their respective miles.

Safety:

Approximately 53,000 runners crossed the Verrazano Bridge and made their way through the other four boroughs of New York, crossing the finish line in Central Park. REACT Teams kept in constant contact with Net Control located at the Race Communications Center (RCC). In addition, members of the Ham Radio Operators group were ensconced in the NYPD Emergency Operations Center.



Safety included notifying the RCC of injuries and Runners who retired from the Race, notifying Law Enforcement or other agencies of issues that were impacting the race way, from garbage strewn on the pavement to spectators crossing the street while runners were passing.

Integrity:

In the 1980 Boston Marathon, Rosie Ruiz started the event and took alternate transportation to rejoin the race at the end and claimed victory.

To that end, REACT Team members, and the other Ham Radio Operators reported to the RCC leaders of the first 4 waves of participants, the two handicap waves, as well as the premier Women and Men's waves.



This way, the RCC and the New York Road Runners knew that racer XYZ had been at each mile of the race.

It was truly an experience like no other, and probably the largest group of Ham Radio and GMRS Operators, approximately 260 men and women, working any event.
